ADEA Community Education

On Saturday, Nov. 14th, ADEA organized its first oral health instruction and dental screening with Mabuhay Health Clinic at the Bayanihan Community Center located on the outskirts of the Tenderloin. This health fair was also MHC's first



experience incorporating a dental component into their holistic care of patients, officially creating an environment of interdisciplinary care that includes mental health assessment, diabetes and nutrition awareness targeting the majority Filipino population at the clinic, and attention from UCSF's Schools of Medicine, Nursing, and Pharmacy. Faculty preceptor Dr. Michael Le presented to a large group of MHC coordinators and volunteers on the importance of oral health, managing dentures, and common pathological conditions. As the patients rotated through each health discipline in the clinic, 6 volunteer UCSF dental students worked closely with Dr. Le to collaborate and assist each other on oral screenings for the patients, provide referrals for dental treatment, and share how patients could obtain Denti-Cal health insurance in the area. Our volunteers really admired the flow of the clinic, as it was a real life application of the interprofessional education workshops they attended as first and second years. They also enjoyed their time interacting with the patients, getting involved in a small circle Q&A session with the pre-dental students when there was down time, and observing the unique clinic environment before them. At the end of the day, everyone agreed that MHC was a place they would love to continue to volunteer at on their own time throughout the year! Tiffany Cheung


ADEA Fall Session




